

		candidate is expected to play an important role in the Institute's
		ongoing projects in regional economic analysis and to pursue and
		participate actively in externally funded research.
		Expected areas of expertise and interest include some
		combination of societal impacts of technological or
		environmental change, applied spatial modeling methods such as
		geographic information systems, spatial econometrics, and
		regional economic and policy analysis. A Ph.D. in applied

economics, geography, urban and regional planning, policy analysis, or related discipline should be obtained by the time of appointment. The ideal candidate will have an extensive background and skills in quantitative regional analysis.

The Regional Research Institute is dedicated to multidisciplinary research on the economic and social development of lagging regions. Its focus is on theories and methods for studying regions, and policies for stimulating their development. On-going research projects deal with rural economic growth and job creation, environmental analysis, energy policy and technology, and methods for regional policy analysis. RRI projects have been funded, among others, by the National Science Foundation, the USDA, the Economic Development Administration, the National Energy and Technology Laboratory, the Alfred P. This is a fixed term, 9-month position with an anticipated starting date of August 16, 2010. Research Assistant Professor appointments are typically renewed at least twice, but appointments can be extended beyond three years upon mutual agreement. 

Information	The conference is normally held between late spring and summer months, and has a
	tradition of rotating between Asia and North America. However, we encourage
	proposal submissions from all continents. The previous conference
	Geoinformatics-2009 was held in Fairfax, Virginia, USA (Washington D.C.
	Metropolitan Area, August 12-14, 2009). This year's Geoinformatics-2010 will be held
	in Beijing, China (June 18-20, 2010).
	In general, the conference organizer needs to take the financial responsibility.
	Previous Geoinformatics conferences have either been self-sufficient or run some
	surplus through conference registrations and various sponsorships. In addition to
	conference site rentals, the conference organizer is responsible for securing at least one
	keynote speaker and hosting a dinner reception. Optionally, conference organizer may
	also offer a field trip and publishing a conference proceeding.
	The proposal should be 3 pages or less and include:
	proposed conference site and a brief description of the site
	a theme with two or three intended sessions that reflect the theme
	an organization structure with a minimum of program and local arrangement
	committee (there should be at least one representative from CPGIS)
	possible conference dates with at least two time slots
	accommodations and price range, any incentives in group discount travel/lodging
	• a budget and methods of balancing the budget (e.g., Proposed registration fee,
	\$1000 contribution to CPGIS, cash awards to student paper competition winners, discount to CPGIS members, sponsors, etc.)
	• other potential benefits of holding the conference at the proposed location and on
	the proposed dates (e.g., petty packing an additional conference or being petty-packed
	with a major conference, exhibits, social events)
	• a statement acknowledging that Geoinformatics conference is mainly sponsored by
	CPGIS
